Welcome to the New Year! We are back in Oakland and looking forward to a fun enterprising year. We will be kicking off the new year with one of our favorite local artists – Jonas Dupuich. Jonas will be grafting the juniper tree that was purchased in 2020 for the October show.



If you recall, the tree was to be used in our October 2021 mini-show which Jonas headlined, but it was determined that it had grown so well since it was purchased that grafting was needed to bring it back to an appropriate bonsai size and style. Jonas will now take that task on for our January meeting.

By now, every club member should be well versed in Jonas' participation with EBBS and his many talents.

Jonas is often our Go To expert and is always available to help us out when we need extra advice or direction on our bonsais.

Jonas is the author of the Bonsai Tonight blog. First created in 2009, the blog features over one thousand articles on a wide range of topics with new posts published every Tuesday and Friday. Jonas has also published a book – *The Little Book of Bonsai*, which serves as an excellent guide for beginners and experienced bonsai artists.

All sale items must be bonsai related, tagged with a twopart sales tag and recorded in the consignment sale sheet. Sales will be subject to a 20% consignment fee that will be calculated based on sales price (i.e.: not including tax).

Tags and sheets will be available at the January 12th meeting or you can print them off from the email this newsletter is in.

All sales will be subject to State sales tax in Oakland at 10.75%. This will be collected at time of sale and will be added to the selling price. Purchasers buying for resale will require a proof of sales permit or resale license and must fill out a resale certificate at purchase time.

<u>Bonsai Calendar</u>

- Take advantage of dormancy to photograph deciduous trees without leaves for study of branches and styling.
- Rotate trees at least once a month.
- Study trunk taper and placement of equally balanced branches; remove excess branching.
- Move all trees into full sun.
- Apply fungicide and pesticide once a month as a preventative.
- Check old wiring as it may be biting in.
