February Meeting: Peter Tea

This month's speakers is one of the top bonsai artists in the United States, Peter Tea. I've taken a dozen workshops with Peter, both here in Oakland, and up in his garden in Auburn, so I can attest that Peter is an incredible teacher! He'll be doing a presentation on **design principles and branch development**, Alise Offeman will also set up a tokonoma this month for Peter to critique!

Peter started learning about Bonsai in 2001. He was an Automotive Technician at a Ford dealership for almost 10 years and Bonsai was his hobby on the side. He joined the Midori Bonsai Club in 2002 and become the president in 2007 and 2008. Most of Peter's Bonsai training came in 2003 when he met Boon Manakitivitpart. Peter signed up for his Bonsai Intensive program after seeing him do a

demonstration at the Sei Boku Kai Bonsai club meeting in San Mateo, California. After finishing his three year intensive program, he graduated and in 2008, started his own Bonsai business called <u>Peter Tea Bonsai</u> to help educate the bonsai community, hone his teaching skills, and make some extra money to fund his Bonsai hobby.

In 2011, he decided to change career paths and traveled to Japan to study Bonsai full-time under Mr. Junichiro Tanaka at Aichien Bonsai Garden. He was an apprentice for over 2 years and was released in 2013 having completed a 5-year apprenticeship early—in only two years! With Mr. Tanaka's blessing, he returned to the United States in 2013 ready to continue his business and work.

Peter's website has some great information on bonsai care (I often cite his advice in this newsletter) and he also sells trees and wire by mail order, so be sure to check that out. You can also check out his Instagram at @peterteabonsai. I've included a bunch of photos on the next page that I took the last time I did a workshop at his garden. You'll see why I'm so excited about this presentation and why you should be too!

Bonsai Calendar

 Many trees are dormant or semi-dormant, so there's still time for re-potting.

.....

- Take advantage of dormancy to photograph deciduous trees without leaves.
- Rotate trees at least once a month to promote balanced growth.
- Improve overall design of trees: reduce or eliminate crisscross, inward branches, excessively heavy top branches, vertical twigs, unnecessary crotch branches, and long internodes.
- Many suggest a zero level of nitrogen during winter, especially for hard pines.
- Reduce watering because the sun is low, but not too much!
- Watch for insects and fungus immediately treat any problems.
- Check old wiring for biting.
