It's Showtime!

It's Showtime and here is the schedule and links! I'm looking forward to seeing everyone attending and helping out!

October 6th, Friday night begins the process of set up. All hands are needed to set up tables, backdrops and trees. Please be at the center by 6:00 PM to begin the process. Trees, accent plants and other items to be displayed should be brought to the hall by 6:30 PM. There will be tables set up to set your plants on until the Vista room has been set-up and arranged. Stick around and help out in setting up tables, chairs and coverings. You will even get fed around 7:30 when the pizza arrives.

We'll be taking a group photo of all the club members who come to help out Friday night, so come prepared to smile!

Silent Auction: You can also bring in items for the silent auction on Friday night and Saturday morning before 10:00 AM. Bring them to the cashier's desk. These items will be fully donated to the club if they sell in the auction. If not, they will be returned to the owner. Make sure you sign in at the sales desk with your items.

Saturday

Plant sale: Saturday will start off with a plant sale for volunteers only. If you worked set-up, or will work during the show or during take down you may select one item from the Plant Sale area ahead of the crowd. There will be no sales on Friday night. This will last from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM. At 10:00 AM the sale and show are open to the public.

Workshop: At 9:30 AM the workshop with Jason Chan will begin. The workshop cost is \$40. It is not often we get a master to help us, so this is time and money very well spent. You do not need to be experienced or have a full slate of tools. This is a workshop to learn about your tree and how best to maintain and shape it. The workshop will take place in the Ebell room (the room down the hall to the left). You will need to sign-up in advance however if you would like to attend. Then you can just show up with your trees and any tools and equipment (wire, soil, etc.) you believe you will need. The monies will be collected at the cashier's desk (cash or check preferred). The workshop will end at 12:30. The workshop will be open for viewing, at this point it is sold out, but you can be wait listed if interested.

Lunch: At 11:30am the hospitality room will open for lunch for the volunteers. The club will be providing sandwiches and drinks and members can bring additional sides and deserts if they so desire. Due to the recent rise in Covid we are limiting the room to volunteers only.

Demonstration: The demonstration will begin at 1:30 PM in the Ebell room and will last until approximately 4:00 PM. The raffle will immediately follow the demonstration. The main prize will be the demo tree. Below is a picture of the tree Jason will be working on and you can win. It is sure to have a positive transformation once he is done.

The silent auction will end at 3:00 PM so be sure and get your final bids in! At 5:00 PM the show and sale will end for the day.

Sunday

Sunday will kick off at 9:30 AM with a critique of the show trees. This is a member's only event and is always very informative. All members are welcome whether you have a tree in the show or not. Jason will review many of the trees on display giving insights and observances not always obvious to the bonsai artist. It will last until 11:00 AM when the show will once again be open to the public.

In the afternoon, starting at 1:00 PM Jason will critique and advise members on trees not displayed in the show. He will also answer any bonsai related question you may have. So, determine what trees you would like professional guidance on and bring them in on Sunday afternoon for a free critique and advice workshop. If you just have questions, feel free to participate.

In the meantime, sales of trees and supplies will continue to take place. Very often, members who were not able to make it on Saturday will bring in exceptional trees for sale on Sunday, so be sure to check back in as the tree or pot you can't live without may be waiting for you.

At 4:00 PM the show and sale ends, and it is once again, all hands-on deck to remove the trees and safely put away all of the furniture and structures. The kitchen will be cleaned and all chairs and tables will be returned to their storage areas.

If you are showing a tree or had items in the plant sale, make sure you are there at 4:00 PM to pick up your items and take them to your vehicle before helping to tear down the tables, etc. Below is the schedule of events and the chair people to contact with questions or suggestions.

Bonsai Calendar

Sun - gradually move shaded deciduous trees into sun to promote fall color.

Watering - Water regularly, but don't over-water.

Fertilizing - Use low or zero nitrogen fertilizers.

Styling/Pruning - Remove seed pods and dry fruit. Do not wire deciduous trees until leaves drop. Renew pinching junipers and severely prune (cut back) one last time this season.

I would like to announce the formation of a planning committee for creating and publishing a book, working title "The First 25 Years of the Bonsai Garden at Lake Merritt". The book is intended to capture in photographs the very best of bonsai trees in the collection at BGLM and to celebrate the many donors, supporters and volunteers who are responsible for caring for and maintaining the museum quality bonsai garden.

Autumn Lights Festival!

The Gardens at Lake Merritt will host their annual Autumn Lights Festival October 12, 13, 14, 2023 from 6 pm - 11 pm. This is a unique opportunity to see the Gardens at night illuminated by amazing light installations created by local Oakland artists. Check out the website https://gardensatlakemerritt.org/autumn-lights-festival-2023/ to see a few of them from last year's festival. Early Bird Tickets cost \$20 for adults, until October 3. Ticket prices go up after that.

But wait! You can get in for free if you volunteer and help with set-up (day-time October 9-12) or docent duty (evenings October 12-14). The Bonsai Garden at Lake Merritt (BGLM) is one of the areas that will be lighted and decorated for the festival. Each member is talented and enthusiastic about the book project and committed to creating and publishing a quality product in time for the 25th anniversary of the BGLM on November 6, 2024. Three new faces are experienced in graphic arts, book layouts and social media technology. We intend to launch pre-sales online in the spring of 2024.

Photographing the bonsai trees will take place in the BGLM workshop using photo studio equipment on hand. The first of four or more photo shoots will be on Saturday, November 4th, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Volunteers are wanted to help in prepping the trees before the scheduled photo shoots [NOTE: a group of club members will be meeting on Oct.29 from 10am-3:30pm]. Prepping will include some pruning and thinning, weeding, removal of moss, top dressing, and oiling pots. Additional photo shoots will be scheduled to capture the peak performance of the trees.

Researching has begun on the most significant historic and legacy trees, such as the historic Daimyo Oak (Tree #115) brought to the U.S. during President Abraham Lincoln's administration in the 1860's, the large Japanese Black Pine (Tree #262) donated by Mas Imazumi and featured at the 1915 Panama-Pacific International Exposition in San Francisco, and legacy trees styled by famous bonsai artists, Jimmy Inadomi, Harry Hirao, and John Naka just to name only a few.

Interviews are being conducted of individuals who are first-hand witnesses to the BGLM in its concept, planning, fundraising, construction, grand opening, care, and maintenance.

We have 12 months to complete the project book and only one time to get it right.
